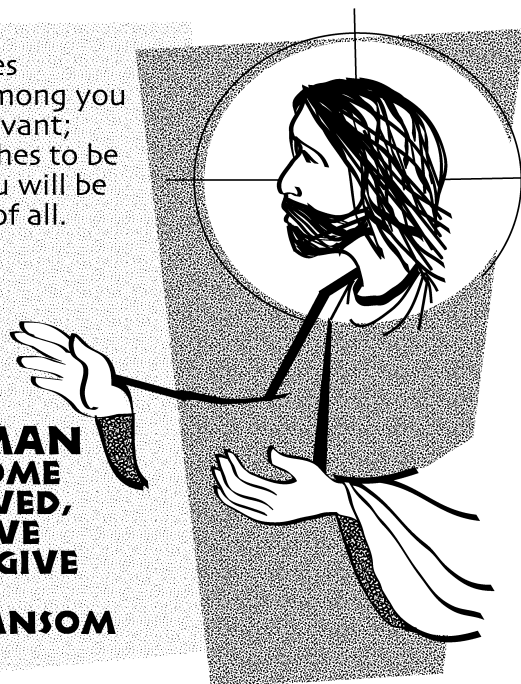

On Liturgy – The Tabernacle--Chris Calderone

Last week we explored the process, beginning with the Second Vatican Council that led to the Mass being celebrated at altars that face the people, as most churches today are accustomed to. Before this practice, the "place of reservation of the Blessed Sacrament" was traditionally located in the center of the high altar. Changing the location and orientation of the altar begged the question: "what about the tabernacle?" This time we'll work backwards.

"Built of Living Stones" (BLS), the US Bishops' most recent document on church design, extensively covers the location of the tabernacle. It cites an important distinction: the latest "General Instructions of the Roman Missal" (GIRM) directs the local bishop to determine the location, either in the sanctuary (including "the old altar") or in a separate chapel. The earlier "GIRM" clearly preferred a separate chapel for the tabernacle. Both BLS and the latest GIRM cite a document from the Congregation of Rites tasked with implementing the Second Vatican Council's new "Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy". Their 1967 document, "Eucharisticum Mysterium", sets the tone: "...it is preferable that Christ not be present eucharistically [...] on the altar where Mass is celebrated. That presence is the effect of the consecration and should appear as such." Moreover, this document mentions a Chapel of Reservation, a "minor but truly worthy altar", or another "special and properly adorned part of the church" as other potential tabernacle locations. It all adds up to today's norm: "there are a number of possible locations" for the tabernacle, and each church has its own.
