filled with wisdom; and the favor of God was upon him. Luke 2:39-40

Today we honor family life in general by pausing to ponder the particular and beautiful hidden life within the home of Jesus, Mary and Joseph. In many ways, their daily life together would have been very similar to other families at that time. But in other ways, their life together is entirely unique and provides us with a perfect model for all families.

By God's providence and design, the family life of Jesus, Mary and Joseph was spoken of in the Scripture very little. We read of the birth of Jesus, the presentation in the Temple, the flight into Egypt and the finding of Jesus in the Temple at age twelve. But other than these stories of their life together, we know very little.

The line from today's Gospel quoted above does, however, give us some insight worth pondering. First, we see that this family "fulfilled all the prescriptions of the law of the Lord…" Though this is in reference to Jesus being presented in the Temple, it should also be understood to apply to all aspects of their life together. Family life, just like our individual lives, must be ordered by the laws of our Lord.

The primary law of the Lord regarding family life is that it must share in the very unity and "communion of love" found in the life of the Most Holy Trinity. Each person of the Holy Trinity has perfect respect for the other, gives selflessly to each other without reserve, and receives each person in their totality. It is their love that makes them one and enables them to act together in perfect harmony as a communion of divine Persons. Though Saint Joseph was not immaculate in his nature, the perfection of love did live in his divine Son and in his immaculate wife. This overwhelming gift of their perfect love would have daily drawn him into the perfection of their lives.

Ponder your own closest relationships today. If you are blessed with a close family, ponder them. If not, ponder the persons put into your life who you are called to love with familial love. Who are you to be there for in good times and in bad? Who are you to sacrifice your life for without reserve? Who are you to offer respect, compassion, time, energy, mercy, generosity and every other virtue? And how well do you fulfill

### **Elevator and Expansion Update:** The overall cost of the project came in at

\$1,119,314.31. The parish took out a loan of \$150,000 from the Diocese of St. Cloud and an additional loan from the New Munich Investors for \$200,000. The loan through the diocese is currently down to \$40,000 thanks



to all those who have made pledges and donations. The parish is looking for individuals who would be interested in covering one or multiple loan payments (roughly \$1,400). Once the loan at the diocese is paid in full, then the New Munich Investors loan will need to be paid in monthly payments. # Jubilee 2025: Pilgrims of Hope

Pope Francis, in his papal bull '*Spes Non Confundit*' ("Hope does not disappoint"), has proclaimed Jubilee 2025. It begins in Rome on Dec. 24 with the opening of the Holy Door of St. Peter's Basilica. In local dioceses it will begin on Holy Family Sunday, Dec. 29, 2024.

The word "jubilee" comes from the Hebrew word *yobel*, which refers to the ram's horn used to announce a jubilee in the Old Testament. A Jubilee is a holy year focused on the forgiveness of sin, conversion and joyful celebration. Passing through holy doors symbolizes a pilgrim's journey of conversion.

All are encouraged to obtain a jubilee indulgence by participating in a pilgrimage, meeting the normal conditions: Pray for the pope's intentions, make a good confession and receive Holy Communion close to the time of earning the indulgence and be sincerely repentant of your sins, to the point of no longer having any sense of attachment to sin.

It is appropriate, but not necessary, that the sacramental Confession and especially Holy Communion and the prayer for the Pope's intentions take place on the same day that the indulgenced work is



performed; but it is sufficient that these sacred rites and prayers be carried out within several days (about 20) before or after the indulgenced act. Prayer for the Pope's intentions is left to the choice of the faithful, but an "Our Father" and a "Hail Mary" are suggested.

To participate in this Jubilee, some will make pilgrimages to Rome. For those from our diocese unable to do so, the Diocese of St. Cloud will establish its own local celebrations.

The faithful are further encouraged to perform spiritual or corporal works of mercy or carry out works of penance (such as abstaining from meat on Fridays). At sacred places, they are to engage in Eucharistic Adoration and meditation, among other spiritual practices. All are asked to pray for the pope, the Church and all who take part in the Jubilee.

In Old Testament times, jubilee years were honored every 50th year. In Christian times (the practice was begun with Pope Boniface VIII in 1300) jubilees were celebrated every 100 years to mark significant anniversaries. They were later shortened to every 50 years and now to every 25 years.

Jubilee 2025 will conclude in local dioceses on Holy Family Sunday, Dec. 28, 2025, and in Rome on the Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord, Jan. 6, 2026, with the closing of the Holy Door of St. Peter's Basilica.

# **GENERAL DECREE**

Crux spes nobis

he Cross gives us hope because it signifies the desire of Jesus to bear, in our place, the punishment for our sins, in short, to save us. Therefore, during this Jubilee of Hope, I call upon all the Faithful of the Diocese of Saint Cloud, by pilgrimages and visits to sacred spaces; by prayers and works of mercy; to bear the burdens of our neighbors, both those here on earth and those being purified on the threshold of Heaven.

To that end, having received special faculties from the Sacred Penitentiary, I hereby exhort the faithful to carry out any of the following acts to obtain, under the usual conditions, a Plenary Indulgence:

§1 A pligrimage or at least a plous visit to any of the following sacred places — the Cathedral of St. Mary; the Shrine of St. Cloud in the Cathedral of St. Mary; the Grasshopper Chapel in Cold Spring; the Shrine of St. Odilia in Onamia; the Shrine of St. Peregrine in Collegeville; the Shrine of the Divine Mercy in Sauk Centre; the Chapel of the Sacred Heart, oratory of the Franciscan Sisters of Little Falls; the Chapel of the Sacred Heart, oratory of the Benedictine Sisters in St. Joseph; the oratory in the Poor Clare Monastery in Sauk Rapids; any church of your Area Catholic Community which you have not yet visited.

Pilgrimages should be marked by a spirit of prayer and reflection while on the journey and, at the destination, should include the celebration of Mass; or a celebration of the Word of God; or a penitential celebration culminating in the opportunity for individual confession and absolution; or praying the Liturgy of the Hours, the Way of the Cross or the Rosary.

Pious visits should include at least 10 minutes of prayer and meditation before the Blessed Sacrament, concluding with the Our Father, the Creed and the Hall Mary or other Marian invocations.

Those who, because of illness, vows, or other grave cause find it impossible to participate in these pilgrimages and pious visits may still obtain the Plenary Indulgence if, even apart from the usual conditions, they are repentant of sin, pray the Our Father, the Creed, and at least one other prayer, and join themselves in spirit to those making the pilgrimages and pious visits. For their part, pilgrims, pious visitors, and those responsible for sacred places, while being careful not to disrupt sacred celebrations, should use modern means of communication (texts, phone calls, broadcasts via internet, etc.) to enable the homebound and others to better participate.

§2 An act of charity — visiting those in need or difficulty, such as the homebound, prisoners, or the ill; fasting for a day from virtual distractions such as media and social networks; making a donation of time or treasure to the poor, to works of the Church, or to the service of the whole human community; any of the Corporal or Spiritual Works of Mercy.

An Extraordinary Opportunity for the Jubilee Year — Two Plenary Indulgences a Day

As a generous grace for this Jubilee, the Holy Father has permitted that, contrary to the usual rule that allows the reception of only one Plenary Indulgence a day, each of the faithful may, with a second reception of Holy Communion in the context of a Eucharistic Liturgy and the completion of a second act to which a Plenary Indulgence is attached, apply that indulgence to the dead.

This decree is promulgated by publication in the Central Minnesota Catholic; it is effective from December 24, 2024, through January 6, 2026.




